NOTICE

In January the Goessel City Council passed an ordinance pertaining to the use and permit of storage and cargo containers. The ordinance prohibits the storage use of cargo containers, railroad cars, truck vans, converted mobile homes, trailers, recreational vehicles, bus bodies, vehicles and similar prefabricated items and structures originally built for purposes other than the storage of goods and materials. These items can however be used if a temporary use permit is filed and approved by the city council. The permit would allow these for a period not to exceed 180 days at a cost of \$20 per month and they must follow certain requirements for placement. Only one such temporary use permit will be given in any one calendar year. When passed, the ordinance allowed for 120 days from the effective date to allow those with these structures to get in compliance. We are quickly approaching that deadline. If you have such structure please contact the city office to apply for a temporary use permit to be presented to the city council. Those who are in violation of this ordinance could be penalized for non-compliance with the ordinance. If you have questions please contact the city office at 620-367-8111.

FIREWORKS INFORMATION

To make this safe and enjoyable for all, here are a few rules that need to be followed.

1. Hours for the discharge of fireworks in the City shall be only between the hours of **8:00 a.m. to 12:00 Midnight on Friday, July 1st & Saturday, July 2nd, noon to 12:00 Midnight on Sunday, July 3rd, and Monday, July 4th from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.**
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge fireworks on City property.
3. Any person discharging fireworks is responsible for all damages resulting from his/her fireworks. They are also responsible for any cleanup of discharged fireworks. The City of Goessel is not responsible for any accidents.
4. Bottle rockets and other similar self-propelled fireworks devices consisting of a tube and attached guiding stick or rod and M80's, shall not be discharged in the City.
5. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, cast or propel fireworks of any kind in the direction of or into the path of any animal, person or group of persons, or from, in the direction of, or into any vehicle of any kind.
6. If the Board of Marion County Commissioners has issued a ban on open burning in an area including the City, there shall be no offer for retail sale, delivery, consignment, gift or other means of furnishing consumer fireworks and there shall be no use of consumer fireworks during the time the ban remains in effect.
7. The Goessel Police and the Fire Chief are authorized to seize and confiscate all fireworks which may be kept, stored or used in violation of Ordinance #235.

CITY-WIDE STREET-SIDE CLEAN UP GOESSEL RESIDENTS ONLY

SATURDAY—JULY 23, 2022—7 AM TO NOON

PUT YOUR ITEMS FOR CLEAN-UP AT THE STREET IN FRONT OF YOUR HOUSE BY 7 A.M. ON SAT., JULY 23RD & WASTE CONNECTIONS WILL COME & PICK IT UP. SEE BELOW FOR ITEMS THAT ARE PROHIBITED

Waste Connections will make one pass thru the city.

Waste Connections asks that all items being collected need to be able to be handled by one or two people safely. General trash, small amounts of bundled brush or limbs, Furniture including, chairs, couches, tables. Appliances including, washers, dryers, dishwashers, microwaves small electrical appliances such as TV's, computers, mixers, blenders. Patio grills, patio furniture, push lawn mowers (free of gas & oil) and lawn trimmers. Tree limbs and branches must be cut in 3ft. lengths and bundled for easy pickup. Any trash not in the trash cart must be in throwaway containers such as boxes or bags, no more than 30-gallon capacity. No loose trash or debris or no box or bag may exceed 40 pounds in weight.

Here is a list of items NO LANDFILL OR TRANSFER STATION will accept:

Car batteries, oil filters, fluorescent light bulbs, propane tanks, any asbestos materials, explosives, paint (we will take empty & dried up paint cans), no hazardous liquids (such as fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, solvents, diesel fuel, gas, oil, transmission fluid, antifreeze, etc...) and tires. REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS AND AIR CONDITIONERS must be tagged by a technician and must have the appropriate paper work with it in order for Waste Connections to pick it up.

THE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE TRAILER WILL BE LOCATED ON THE PARKING LOT SOUTH OF THE CITY BUILDING FROM 9-11. QUESTIONS? PLEASE CALL THE CITY OFFICE AT 367-8111.

The City of Goessel will be contracting with Wildcat Shredding of Newton to provide 2 containers that are secure with locks into which materials to be shredded can be placed. The containers will then be picked up and transported to Wildcat Shredding where they will be shredded. The materials will not be shredded on site but will be transported in a secure vehicle and shredded at a secure facility. Suggested materials for shredding are: old bank statements, checks & check registers, junk mail such as credit card applications, old loan papers, insurance policies, old tax returns, etc. The bins will be available in the **community room of the city building during business hours (8-12 & 1-5 M-T & 8-Noon F) the weeks of July 18-22 & July 25-29. This service is open to Goessel residents only.**

Dog Licenses Due

Per Goessel City Code, dog license renewals are due July 1st of each year for all dogs within the city limits. After July 31st, a 50% penalty will be added. Please contact the city office to renew or purchase a new license for your dog(s). There is a **limit of 2** dogs per residence. If you have been granted permission in the past to have 3 dogs and one of the dogs dies or you get rid of one of the dogs, you cannot replace it with another dog. The **2 dog limit** is going to be strictly enforced. You can drop off your rabies vaccination certificate along with the money for the tags and we will mail the tag out to you. Cost of license: Spayed or Neutered—\$4, Male—\$7, Female—\$12. There are no longer breed restrictions.

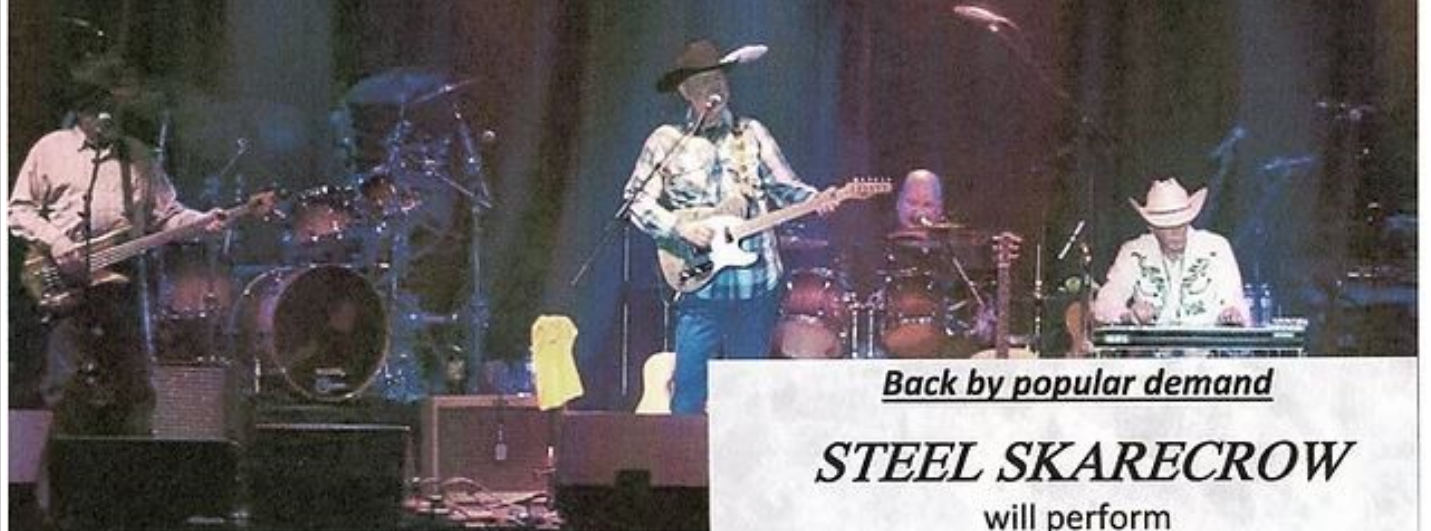
